FOR GREATER GOOD **Community Fund turns cents into change**

Needham Elementary School's Special Education department will now be able to provide students with iPad learning systems.

The Physical Education department can continue expanding their Ninja course.

These are just two of 16 projects and programs to receive an Operation Round-Up grant from the JCREMC Community Fund in Fall 2022.

Operation Round-Up grants are made possible by JCREMC members who elect to have their monthly electric bills rounded up to the nearest whole dollar. The rounded amount is placed in the JCREMC Community Fund to provide financial support for charitable causes and non-profit organizations in the communities served by JCREMC. The average amount each participant contributes in a year is \$6.

Local organizations can apply for up to \$5,000 in project-based grant funding each April and October. An independent advisory board oversees the JCREMC Community fund and selects grant recipients. The fund is administered by the Johnson County

Community Foundation.

THE JCREMC ANNUAL MEETING is April 15, 2023, at Franklin Community High School, 2600 Cumberland Dr., Franklin.

The meeting is a time for JCREMC consumers, directors, and staff to celebrate the previous year and look forward to the future. It's also the time when members vote in the Board of Directors Election.

The 2023 meeting theme, "Cooperative Solutions in Complex Times," represents the cooperative's innovation in serving members in an ever-evolving energy sector, said John Sturm, JCREMC CEO and JCFiber President.

"There has been so much change in the electric industry this year-both in how electricity is produced and used," he said. "At JCREMC, we pride ourselves on being forward-thinking and tackling those changes head-on for the benefit of our members."

The doors open at 8 a.m. for the traditional breakfast and voting. The Blue River Band will provide entertainment at 9 a.m., followed by the Business Meeting at 10 a.m. Sturm and members of the board will give updates on the cooperative's financial standing, new programs, rates, and JCFiber construction.

Activity bags will be provided for children to take into the Performing Arts Center during the Business Meeting. Families can also elect to sit in overflow seating in the cafeteria where the meeting will be live-streamed.

Districts 1 and 4 are up for election in 2023.

JCFiber simplifies broadband plan offerings, lowers monthly rates

JCFiber will lower broadband rates beginning on the 75 Mb package will be grandfathered in

March 1. The rates decreases will apply to all new and existing JCFiber customers.

The price decrease comes on the heels of the JCREMC broadband subsidiary simplifying monthly plans.

New plans are Standard (150 Mbps), Plus (500 Mbps), and Premium (1 Gbps). The monthly price for Standard will decrease from \$84.95 to \$79.95, Plus will decrease from \$109.95 to \$99.95. Premium will decrease from \$129.95 to \$114.95. These prices are all-inclusive, with no hidden fees, taxes, or other charges.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

JCFiber continues to close the digital divide in Johnson County and surrounding areas.

The company's 4-year expansion is more than halfway complete with all residents in Zone 1 eligible to sign up for service. Approximately 85 percent of residents in Zone 2, 75 percent in Zone 3, and 10 percent in Zone 4 can now sign up. Postcards are sent to eligible addresses when service becomes available.

Affordable Connectivity Program


JCFiber participates in the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) from Federal Communications the Commission. Eligible households can receive a \$30 per month discount toward internet services.

ACP participants are eligible (but not required) to choose JCFiber's Basic 75 Mb service package, which is \$64.95 per month before the \$30 per month ACP credit is applied.

For a limited time, JCREMC also offers a rebate for the installation of 240-volt electric vehicle charging outlets and free programmable EV chargers for qualifying members.
